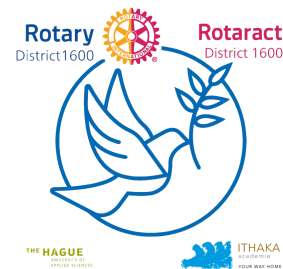

### Youth Peace Summit at Peace Concert in The Hague

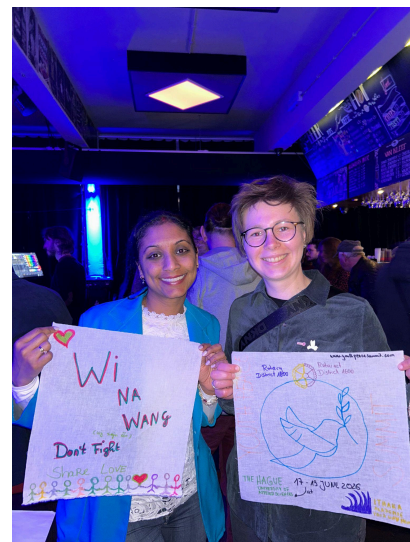
On **Monday, March 30**, the Youth Peace Summit team was invited to a music concert at **Musicon** in The Hague.
